Meeting Called to Order at:19:34.
Role Call: Present Robert Houser, Walter Diskin, Bert Tesky and Gary Sandy. Joe Samsill absent.
Motion by Diskin, Second by Sandy, that minutes of Sept 5, be accepted as furnished. Approved unanimously.

Manager Report: Profit and loss statement on file. Dunham reported that he had sent out past due notices to all those past due at time of billing, which resulted in a lower accounts receivable. Activity has remained high. He reported that the 5 hp pump at the Lucas Well went bad. It was replaced under warranty. A check valve was put in at the shortly thereafter. The 3 hp pump at Chimney Ranch also went out. The weight of the pump had pulled the power cable loose. The threads were stripped on the pipe. Dunham suggested that due to conditions that we activate the D & R well. It will cost approximately \$2000.00 to do so. The electrical is in. The project to enclose the well heads is going ahead, with enclosures being prefabricated by Dunham and J. B. House. He reported that he has picked up the maps and documents from Mrs. Albins. A discussion followed in regard to a meeter box at the end of Poplar Street next to the old hospital.

OLD BUSINESS:

Discussion on the laws and regulations regarding cross connection by DEQ. The State Fire Marshals Office is opposing these rulings and will seek to have them changed or not be held necessary for municipalities or Water Districts. Concern was expressed that water hammer might develop if a fire hydrant is turned off too fast.

NEW BUSINESS:

Property security was discussed but Dunham has not had time to look into. Diskin brought up looking for additional water sources in case the situation worsens with the present wells. Tesky reported that he had talked to the Forest Service about looking for water on Forest Service property. He stated that they said the chances were dim. Discussion followed on possible sources.

Tesky inquired as to state of Albins tract out on the Goodwin Road. Discussion followed as to who is responsible for any necessary booster and lines to service the area if it develops. He then questioned Dunham as to the meters that were being used to steal water. Tesky said he could show us where it is.

Public:

Mr. Sherman Bledsoe explained his problem in getting water to his property from our lines, which cross someone else's property. It appeared to be an expensive proposition. Dunham will go with him to look at the situation and determine if it is feasible. Mrs. Pam Fowler complained that she had not gotten any satisfaction in getting the meter to her property put in her name. She said she had tried several times but, had not heard from the water District. The meter will be turned over tomorrow. It was apparently a temporary situation due to misunderstanding and problems not likely to be repeated.
